Editor's Note: Controversy Erupts over Skeptical Environmentalist

In the past few months we have received a number of comments on the December 2002 article entitled, "Becoming a Skeptical Environmentalist: Debunking the Eco-Myths that Face the Industry." Many of our readers enjoyed and appreciated the article and plan to use it as a resource. Others took issue with the article based on the growing controversy that Bjorn Lomborg's book has stirred in the scientific and academic world.
